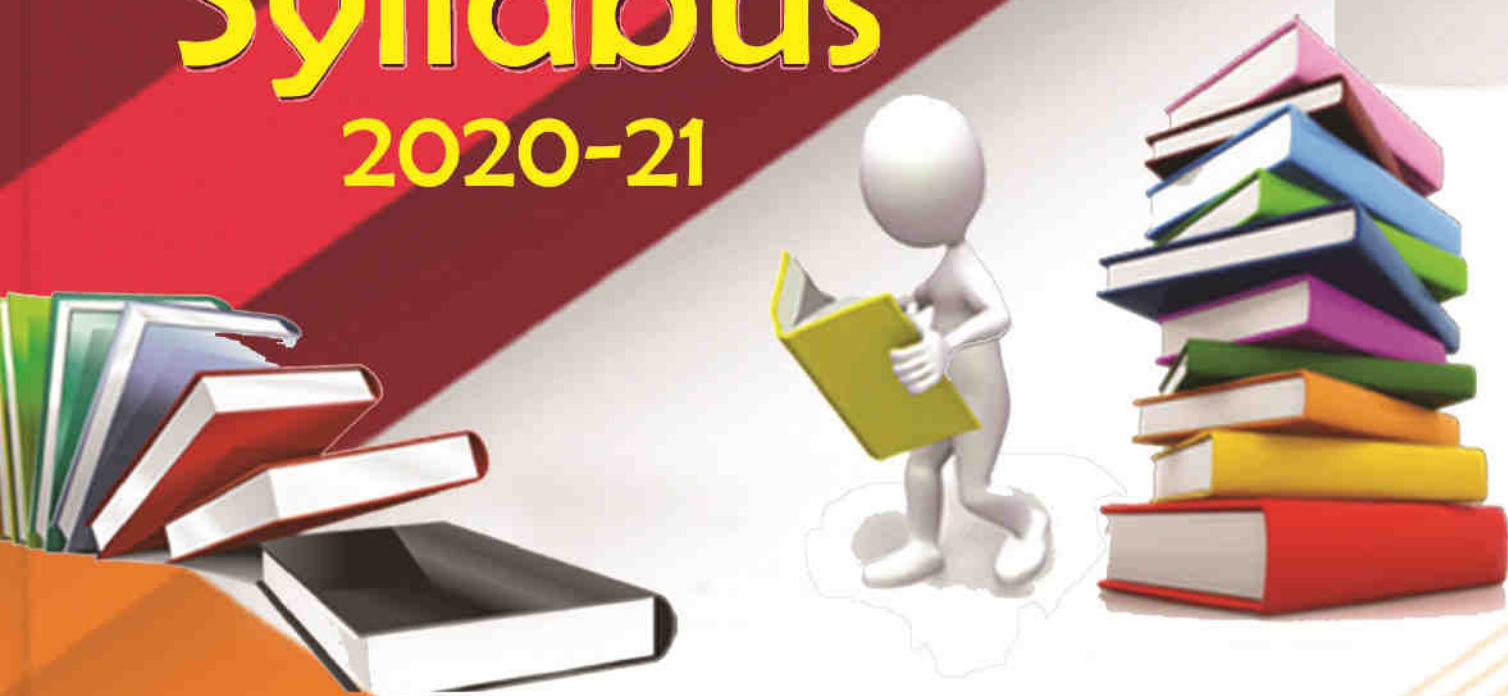

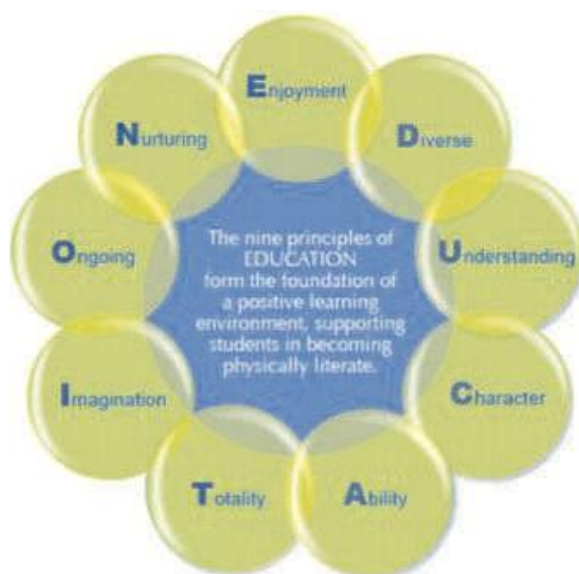
FORWORD
